Biting Procedure



Grass Roots Nursery Group: Biting Incidents

Purpose:

To outline procedures for addressing biting incidents at Grass Roots Nursery Group, promoting a safe and supportive environment for all children.

Key Principles:

- **Understanding and Support:** We understand that biting is a common developmental stage and offer support to both the biting child and the child who is bitten.
- **Individualised Approach:** We will work with each child and family to identify underlying causes and develop appropriate strategies.
- Safety and Well-being: Prioritise the safety and well-being of all children.
- Confidentiality: Maintain confidentiality regarding biting incidents.

Procedures:

1. Identifying Causes:

- Observe the child who bites to identify potential triggers or underlying issues.
- Work with parents to understand the child's development and behaviour.

2. Preventative Measures:

- Implement strategies to address potential triggers, such as altering routines, providing additional attention, or offering sensory resources.
- Monitor the child closely and intervene if necessary.

3. Responding to Bites:

- o Comfort and support the child who has been bitten.
- Administer first aid as needed.
- Document the incident and notify parents/carers.
- Maintain confidentiality of the children involved.

4. Addressing the Biting Child:

- Remove the child from the situation and explain why biting is unacceptable.

- Positive Reinforcement: Reward positive behaviour and model appropriate ways to express emotions.
- Review and Evaluation: Regularly review the effectiveness of strategies and make adjustments as needed.
